## **PREVENTIVE/RECALL APPOINTMENTS – AS IMPORTANT AS SUNSCREEN**

You wouldn't send your kids out to play in the sun all day without reminding them to put on their sunscreen. And you shouldn't send your patients out of your office without reminding them to schedule a preventive/recall appointment.

Preventative treatment such as prophylaxis, fluoride treatment, and oral hygiene instruction promotes pain-free dental health. Six-month recall appointments are important because early signs of periodontal disease can be detected and treated.





As a dental provider, please encourage your patients to come back to your office for their six-month recall. If you do not have your own system for recalling patients, here are some suggestions:

- Mail appointment reminders
- Make reminder phone calls 48–72 hours in advance of an appointment
- Adjust office hours to best accommodate your patient population
- Hang posters around the waiting room listing the benefits of visiting the dentist every six months
- Remind patients at the beginning of an appointment that they will need to schedule their six-month recall before leaving that day

Imagine the impact you will have on the oral health of your patients by reminding them about the importance of regular dental checkups and help them to enjoy a lifetime of healthy teeth and gums.
